## **January**

**Saturday January 5th 7:30PM Small Time Gay Bar**

This film explores rural gay bars, often oasis's for GLBT communities which lack many social opportunities when compared with urban communities, and how they cope in places where isolation is the norm.

**Saturday January 12th 7:30PM F\*\*K**

This provocative documentary takes a look on all sides of the infamous F-word. Its taboo, obscene and controversial, yet somehow seems to permeate every single aspect of our culture-, to the schoolyard to the Senate floor in Washington D.C.

**Saturday January 19th 7:30PM Bread And Roses**

Loosely based on a 1990 janitor's strike at Century City in Los Angeles, it's seen through the eyes of Maya (Pilar Padilla) a young Latina, who hopes only to find work in the U.S.

**Saturday January 26th 7:30PM Un Poquito de Tanta Verdad**

In the summer of 2006, a broad-based, non-violent, popular uprising exploded in the southern Mexican state of Oaxaca. Some compared it to the Paris Commune, while others called it the first Latin American revolution of the 21st century. But it was the people's use of the media that truly made history in Oaxaca.

## **February (Black History Month)**

**Saturday February 2nd 7:30PM The Rosa Parks Story**

Angela Bassett stars in the story that sparked the birth of the modern civil rights movement in the late 1950s. Parks took the only available seat in the first row of the "colored" section on a city bus; when a white woman boarded and the driver demanded that the black riders in her row move, everyone complied except Parks.

**Saturday February 9th 7:30PM 10,000 Black Men Named George**

Asa Philip Randolph, a black journalist and educated socialist trying to establish a voice for these forgotten workers agrees to fight for the Pullman porters' cause in Detroit and form the first black union in America.

**Saturday February 16th 7:30PM Deacons for Defense**

Takes place in 1965 Bogalusa, LA, when in response to the beating by police, Marcus organizes the Deacons, an all-black defense group dedicated to patrolling the black section of town and protecting its residents from the more violent aspects of "white backlash."

**Saturday February 23rd Murder Of Fred Hampton**

It began as a film portrait of Hampton and the Illinois Black Panther Party, but half way through the shoot, Hampton was killed by Chicago policeman. Filmmakers arrived a few hours after the murder to shoot film footage of the crime scene that was later used to contradict the official version.
